This bibliography provides insight into the topic of blood quantum and the problematic effects regarding the cultural, biological, social, legal and political future of Native American tribal nations who use this mechanism to determine tribal citizenry. The majority of the resources were found using electronic databases and the World Wide Web, and include a variety of scholarly articles written within the last ten years. The bibliography is divided into eight sections or formats: books, journals, newspapers, dissertations/thesis, Websites, and social media platforms such as blogs, YouTube, and Facebook. In the book section, titles marked with an * (asterisk) are books available through the Noowuh Knowledge Center and is loanable by contacting Mary Gibson at (207) 504-6765.
